## **Thank You Titus!**

I had the opportunity to meet Thaddeus Bullard, better known as Titus this month at an award ceremony for LIFT, Learning Independence For Tomorrow. LIFT's mission is simple. "... to inspire and empower people with neurodiversity to learn, thrive and succeed." Titus embodies their mission because he CARES about how other people in the most genuine way. He like many others believes giving someone a chance matters. I thought about his speech recently when researching new change for Florida High School Graduation Requirements for Students with Disabilities. The rule changes the definition of how "significant cognitive



disabilities" is defined and provides new guidelines for how a student with disabilities obtains services.

CHANGE MATTERS! The true impact of this rule will require students with cognitive disabilities to work harder in traditional environments that are already challenging. Instead of providing necessary support to succeed, students must overcome obstacles to prove they require support services. Legislators explained the rule change was necessary to comply with the federal law, Every Student Succeeds Act. However, many disagree and believe it will create significant setbacks!

Jeff Skowronek, executive director of Pepin Academies charter schools for students with disabilities, cautioned the State Board that the proposal would hurt schools' ability to focus on children's unique learning styles. "The rules will constrain us," Skowronek said. "They will take students off of access that we have worked diligently to ensure belong there. Then we don't serve the students the best we can in the process." (Education Week)
